Cross-Border Artificial Intelligence Discourse: RSBP Batam & NTUH Taiwan's Collaborative Focus Group Discussion

Rumah Sakit Badan Pengusahaan Batam (RSBP) and National Taiwan University Hospital (NTUH) Hsin-Chu Branch celebrated their three-year collaboration by organizing a Focus Group Discussion (FGD) on Tuesday, 12 December 2023, at the RSBP Meeting Room. Batam's Prosperity Unveiled: Reflecting on Investment Realization in 2023

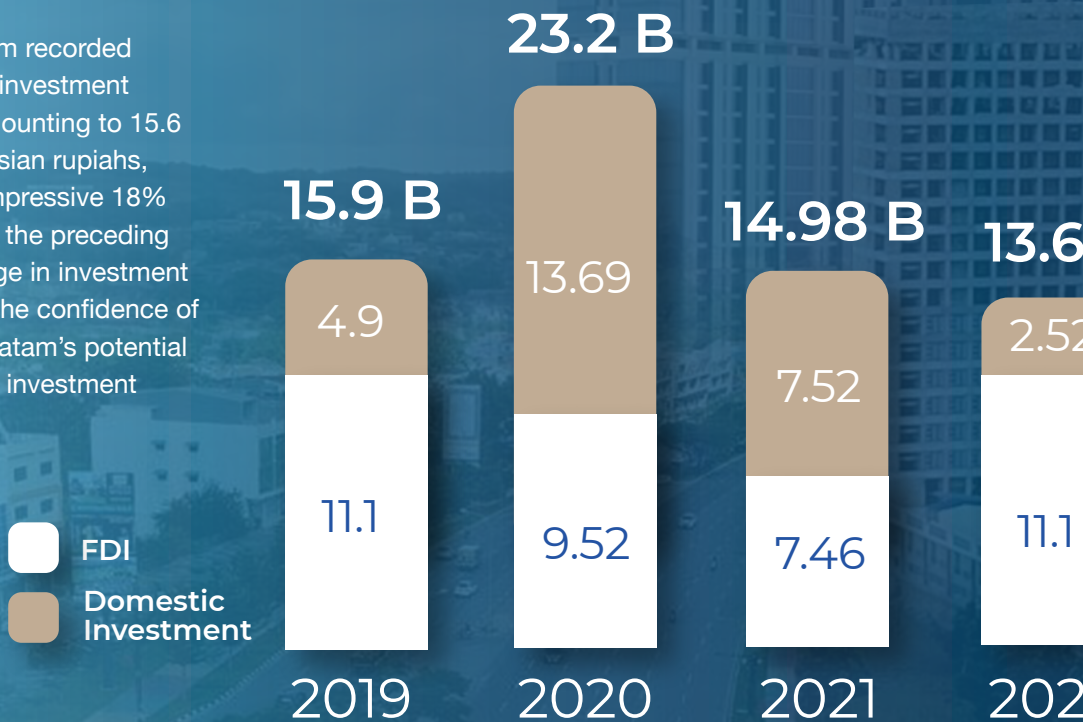
Batam has emerged as a burgeoning hub for investment and economic development in recent years. With its strategic geographical positioning and conducive investment policies, Batam has attracted significant investments, contributing to its economic growth and development. In 2023, Batam witnessed substantial investment realization and notable advancements across various sectors, propelling its economic trajectory forward.

In 2023, Batam recorded a remarkable investment realization amounting to 15.6 trillion Indonesian rupiahs, marking an impressive 18% increase from the preceding year. This surge in investment underscores the confidence of investors in Batam's potential and favorable investment

climate. Of the total investment, Foreign Direct Investment (PMA) accounted for 8.8 trillion rupiahs, while Domestic Direct Investment (PMDN) contributed 6.8 trillion rupiahs to the economic landscape of Batam.

The sectors driving Foreign Direct Investment (PMA) in Batam predominantly include Machinery, Electronics, Medical Instruments, Electrical Equipment,

Precision, Optics, and Timepieces industries. Following closely are the Food Industry, Housing, Industrial Zones, and Office sectors. On the other hand, Domestic Direct Investment (PMDN) is primarily dominated by investments in Housing, Industrial Zones, and Office spaces, with additional contributions from Transportation, Warehousing, Telecommunications, as well as the Electricity, Gas, and



Water sectors.

Throughout 2023, Batam saw significant investment inflows from various countries, with Singapore, Hong Kong, China, France, and Japan emerging as the leading investors. The continued interest and investment from these countries signify Batam's appeal as a promising investment destination and its strategic importance in the regional economy.

In tandem with investment realization, Batam's export sector exhibited resilience and dynamism in 2023. The island's exports totalled 14.6 billion USD, reflecting its robust trade activities

and global connectivity. This significant export figure further reinforces Batam's role as a pivotal trade gateway and export-oriented economy in Southeast Asia.

The year 2023 proved to be pivotal for Batam's economic landscape, characterized by robust investment inflows, sectoral diversification, and resilient export performance. The substantial investment realization, coupled with strategic sectoral developments, underscores Batam's emergence as a dynamic economic powerhouse in the region. As Batam continues to attract investments

and foster economic vibrancy, sustained efforts in infrastructure development, investment facilitation, and talent enhancement will be vital to harness its full potential and propel inclusive growth for the island and its populace. (dn)

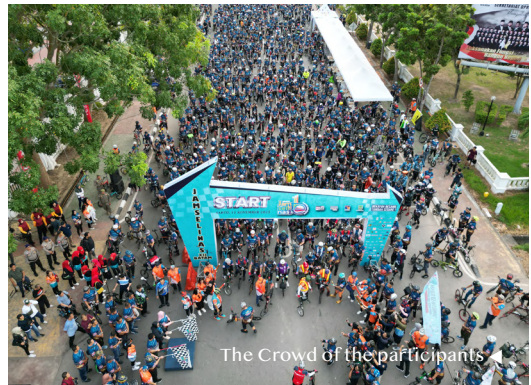
The event was flagged off by the Chairman of BP Batam, Muhammad Rudi. He stated

Hang Nadim International Airport, Launched Direct Flights to International Departures China, Vietnam, Thailand and South Korea

Chairman of BP Batam, Muhammad Rudi, expressed his appreciation for the increase in flight activity at Hang Nadim International Airport, which has been going well.

This continues the strategic efforts of PT Batam International Airport (BIB), which has expanded flight connectivity by opening an international route, namely Batam - China, on January 20, 2024.

On the other hand, the Batam - Thailand and Batam - Vietnam flight routes are planned to open in April and June 2024, respectively. Meanwhile, flights from South Korea to Batam using Jeju Air airline will start in July 2024.

According to Muhammad Rudi, this step will have a positive influence on the level of economic growth in Batam.

Not only that, but the Batam - China route is also an effort to promote Batam to the international world.

“I hope that this flight will run smoothly, so that Batam’s economy can grow positively. This is an opportunity to introduce Batam’s progress to the world. We have prepared infrastructure to support Batam’s progress. This is also needed to welcome future investment challenges,” he said on Wednesday (17/1/2024).

Muhammad Rudi said that BP Batam is currently accelerating infrastructure development to support the progress of Batam and realize the ideals of a New Batam City.

Meanwhile, the Main Director of BIB, Pikri Ilham Kurniansyah, said that international flights from Batam to China or vice versa are expected to open up business and





investment opportunities in the tourism, trade, and industrial sectors, and of course, will provide new opportunities and experiences for customers to explore interesting destinations in both countries.

Batam Port had an Impressive 8.1 Million Ship Passengers in 2023

The tremendous growth of Batam, as well as the positive development of Batam's tourism sector in 2023, have contributed to an increase in the number of ship passengers at Batam Ports, which now stands at 8.1 million. Batam Ports had a 48 percent rise in domestic and international ship passengers in 2023, compared to the previous year's total of 5.4 million.

Of the 8.1 million passengers who arrived and left, 55%, or approximately 4.4 million, used Batam's international ports, which included Batam Center International Ferry Terminal, Sekupang International Ferry Terminal, Nongsapura International Ferry Terminal, Harbor Bay International Ferry Terminal, and Senimba Bay International Ferry Terminal.

Meanwhile, the Domestic Terminal recorded 3.6 million people arrive and depart, with 49 percent coming from the Telaga Punggur Domestic Ferry Terminal and 33 percent

coming from the Sekupang Domestic Ferry Terminal.

The number of visits (passengers arriving) at the International Ferry Terminal has increased by 96%, from 1.1 million in 2022 to 2.2 million in 2023. Visits to the Domestic Ferry Terminal increased by 17 percent, from 1.5 million to 1.8 million in 2023.

This achievement has a direct relationship to the efforts of the Batam Business Agency (BP Batam) and the support of the Central and Regional governments in expediting infrastructure development, which has an impact on the progress of the Batam tourism sector. The growth in the number of ship passengers in Batam is a good indicator for the city's economic resurgence. This demonstrates that Batam remains a popular tourism attraction, both domestically and internationally. (ib)

Batam Offers a New Educational Tourist Attraction for Kids

Batam currently offers a new educational tourism destination, Batam Zoo Paradise, which had a soft opening on December 21, 2023. Batam Zoo Paradise, located in Batam Center, does not have any wild animals, allowing children to engage directly with the animals.

Capybaras, merino sheep, ponies, ostriches, emus, rearing birds, macaw birds, peacocks, spotted deer, iguanas, rabbits, brahma chickens, turkeys, kate chickens, alpacas, cats, and dogs, among many more creatures, can be found.

However, kids prefer the pygmy goat. This mammal, which normally lives on slopes, originates from the Cameroon Valley in West Africa. Pygmy goats have incredibly small bodies. Pygmy goats, unlike other goats,

are lively, friendly, and adorable. Hundreds of tourists have energized this new tourism hotspot during its first week of operation. On average, there are between 200 and 300 visits every day. Batam Zoo Paradise is open from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Adult tickets are affordable, costing IDR 50,000 (USD 4) on weekdays and IDR 70,000 (USD 5) on weekends. Children can get tickets for IDR 30,000 (USD 2) on weekdays and IDR 45,000 (USD 3) on weekends, which include free entrance to the swimming pool.

Batam Zoo Paradise will have its grand opening in February 2024. (ib)

EVALUATING 2023, BP BATAM HELD LEADERS OFFSITE MEETING TOWARDS A GLAZING FUTURE

In evaluating performance achievements in 2023 and preparing for the best performance in 2024, BP Batam, together with the BP Batam Supervisory Board, held a Leaders' Offsite Meeting at the Marriot Hotel Meeting Room on January 26, 2024.

The Chairman of BP Batam stated that BP Batam had prepared various plans for the bright future of Batam. The planning is prepared through performance evaluation and superior program planning.

During 2023, BP Batam made brilliant achievements. One of them is the development of the Batu Ampar Port, which continues to be expedited, including the procurement of new loading and unloading equipment. Not only that, but cooperation in developing Batam's Hang Nadim International Airport is an important milestone in strengthening city connectivity.

Road construction in Batam continues to be the main focus. This effort anticipates

the growth in the number of road users, which increases every year, and supports the smooth flow of logistics. During 2023, road construction has been carried out by BP Batam towards the new city of Batam, starting from the development of Hang Jebat street (Intersection of Batu Besar – Turi), Port - Airport Main Corridor Road (Laluan Madani Intersection - Punggur Roundabout). Currently, the construction of the Sei Ladi Flyover - Laluan Madani Intersection is also underway. Apart from that, the development of the Gajah Mada Road Phase 4, the tender process for which will begin at the end of 2023, is targeted for completion by the end of 2024.

Furthermore, projects such as the WTP in Muka Kuning Reservoir and Flood Management Drainage in Batu Aji, as well as the construction of the VVIP building at Hang Nadim International Airport, are underway. In addition, the focus on developing the Rempang Eco-City Area as a National Strategic Project (PSN) shows commitment to building an environmentally friendly and sustainable city.

For the BP Batam Work Program in 2024, Infrastructure for Marine Connectivity is also urgently needed. This includes the Revitalization of the Batu Ampar Port Terminal Pier, Replacement of the Sekupang Domestic Passenger Terminal Pier Pontoon, and Revitalization of the Kabil Liquid Bulk Port Pier Pool.

With various programs implemented in 2024, it is hoped that all BP Batam levels, from leadership to staff level, will focus on pursuing the targets set by their Deputies in 2024. Secretary to the Coordinating Minister for Economic Affairs, Susiwiyono Moegiharso, as Chairman of the BP Batam Supervisory Board, emphasized the importance of support for the smooth implementation of investment increase

programs. With synergy between the government, private sector, and society, Batam is ready to encounter future challenges with high confidence and optimism. (aw)

Zhuzhou CRRC Times Electric Co., Ltd. is a company based in Zhuzhou, Hunan Province, China. The company is a subsidiary of China South Locomotive & Rolling Stock Corporation Limited (CRRC), which is a leading company in the railway and public transportation industry in China.

Zhuzhou CRRC Times Electric Co., Ltd. focuses on the development, production, and sale of electrical equipment for rail vehicles, including power systems, vehicle control systems, and related electronic components. The company is involved in the development of transportation technology that is more environmentally friendly and efficient.

TEC is interested in investing in the field of Autonomous Rail Rapid Transit (ART) or rail-less trains. TEC has built and developed railway transportation projects in the United Arab Emirates, Malaysia, Argentina, Europe, and China.

Batam is seen as having great potential for developing this project, considering that currently Batam is actively engaged in infrastructure development, and this project is highly suitable for Batam New City.
